With William Shakespeare as its foundation, the SHAKESPEARE FESTIVAL in STRATFORD aims to set the standard for classical and contemporary theatre in North America. We have included six plays as well as optional selections at both festivals. There will be time to enjoy the galleries, gardens, boutiques and restaurants that enhance these two charming towns. In addition we will enjoy the splendid countryside of New York State with stops in CORNING, ITHACA, and beautiful LAKE CANANDAIGUA.
